SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Chambers, one aspect of the bill is the use of the independent medical examiner. The only portion of the total package that this amendment would adopt is the use of the IME.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Any other discussion on the Landis amendment? Seeing none, Senator Landis, do you wish to close? He waives closing. We'll now vote on the Landis amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
