PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. We'll now vote on the motion to return. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: (Mike not activated) ...have members check in and have a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Would the senators please check in. Senator Bromm, Senator Beutler, Senator Bernard-Stevens, please check in. Senator Jones. Senator Cudaback, Senator Pirsch, please check in. Senator Landis, Senator Lynch, Senator Ashford, please check in. Would the senators please check in. Senator Ashford, Senator Landis, Senator Lynch, please check in. And, Senator Pirsch, please check in. We're looking for Senator Ashford and Senator Lynch. We'll proceed with the roll call vote on the motion to return LB 838 to Select File.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2638-39 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted. We have returned to Select File. Senator Bernard-Stevens for opening on the amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just to move the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Does anyone wish to address the amendment? Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Bernard-Stevens, could I ask you a question, please?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. Do I understand that the fact situation is that a student transfers from their resident district, pardon me, to a, for example, private school, and then they complete the eighth grade or whatever level it might be, but they would have to complete whatever is offered at that private school and then they would have under your bill or your amendment the option to return to the resident district or to the option district that they came from when they went to the private
