CLERK: 28 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the return of the bill.

SENATOR HALL: The bill has been returned. Senator Fisher, to open on the amendment.

SENATOR FISHER: Mr. Speaker and members, thank you. As we talked in the returned bill, the amendment is on page 2610. I think we've heard the debate, I think the issue still remains that these patrolmen are out there, they're your neighbors, they work every day. Their job is not just 24 hours, or 8 hours a day. They are on call 24 hours a day. They strap on their side pistol and they go to work. They are expected to be out there under some very duress times. I think they are worthy of this retirement program and I ask for your support and if you have any questions I'll be glad to try and answer them.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Fisher. Senator Crosby, your light is next. Senator Crosby waives off. Senator Schimek, on the amendment.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, I would just like to say that first of all I had a constituent call me this morning who is a patrolman and mentioned this issue was coming up this afternoon and I said I was aware of it and said that I was sympathetic to it, and I am. However, I think the discussion this afternoon has been very good. It has raised some valid concerns and I think what I want to ask Senator Horgan if he can, is to tell us maybe in some kind of dollar and cents figures what the adoption of this particular amendment might mean. I mean we've had people talking about the short-term and long-term effects, but I guess I'd appreciate having a little bit more in black and white if you would, Senator Horgan.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Horgan, would you respond.

SENATOR HORGAN: Thank you, Senator Schimek. If any of you have your fiscal note on LB 639, which is Senator Fisher's bill and you can see in there on page 2 it talks about the unfunded actuarial accrued liability.
