SENATOR FISHER: I believe that this was designed that if they were in the patrol prior, then they served, they were called to active duty, they were then credited back for their term of service.

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Well in the statute it doesn't put a limitation as to the amount of years served in the armed services under 81-2034, the section of statute that you cite to. It doesn't put a limitation...

SENATOR FISHER: I would have to look at that statute, I can't recall it from...

SENATOR ABBOUD: Well I'll just continue on if that's...do you have an answer for that one?

SENATOR FISHER: Well it appears just quickly looking at first blush here, that they have to be in employment before they serve their time in the armed service, then they go back to the armed service and then they are credited for that time while they are away from the patrol. And of course there is a cap on this so they couldn't go on forever and ever.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Well it states under 81-2034 and I guess this is more for legislative history, it states that any member of the patrol who while a member of the Nebraska State Patrol, and then there is some other language in it, continues on and it says shall enter into and served in the armed forces of the United States.

SENATOR HALL: Time. Thank you, Senator Abboud. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Substitute Speaker, Senator Hall, I respectfully call the question.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Haberman. The question is, shall debate cease? Are there five seconds? There are plenty. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
