SENATOR CHAMBERS: ..a reasonable adjustment. I don't think it's going to burden the bill. It makes the information more readily accessible to people and I don't know what impact it would have with reference to how Senator Hall feels about his amendment. Senator Hall, may I allow Senator Landis to ask you a question on my time?

SENATOR HALL: Absolutely, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR LANDIS: At Senator Chambers' request, to have county libraries be able to request and receive a copy of the notice and the regs, as I recall, as promulgated, is that a satisfactory result for the three of us to reach here?

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, Senator Landis, why don't we just send it to them? Why do we...if we just send it to them I'll go away.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Hall, you are next.
