I will cooperate with anybody or any group if they're moving in the same direction that I am, even if a minute before we collaborated we had been figuratively speaking at each other's throats. But I have not worked in close conjunction with the trial attorneys association or whatever they're called. Oh, NATA. It makes me think of every time I hear them what Spiro Agnew referred to some people as being nattering nabobs of negativism. And I found out later that somebody wrote that for him, but every time I see or hear NATA, that's what I think about, nattering nabobs. But I want to be sure that they realize that they're encompassed under my umbrella of criticism. I'm very disappointed in the way they've folded. I don't think they did that good a job in presenting the workers' side. They started out running 100 miles an hour, not realizing I guess that we're in a marathon. So in the first 100 yards, they were ahead of everybody because the rest of us know we have 26 miles to run so we pace ourselves. We're going as strong now as we did at the beginning, if not stronger. They've disappeared. So I want to be even-handed in parceling out criticism that I think is richly deserved by them. I'm supporting this amendment but I still cannot support the bill. Senator Landis, I don't have any more amendments. The second amendment that I thought was up there was a duplicate of one that I had discussed so that took care of any amendments that I would have.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We'll now vote on the Landis-Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Landis' and Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted. Other amendments.

CLERK: Senator Schimek's amendment is back before us, Mr. President.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Schimek. Is anyone authorized to handle Senator Schimek's amendment? If not, we'll pass over that. The next amendment.
