

CLERK: Senators Hall and Landis would move to amend, Mr. President.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Mr. Clerk, if you would, could you read the amendment, please.

CLERK: Senator, (reads amendment on page 2668 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. I would urge adoption of the amendment and give the balance of my time to Senator Landis.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I accept the idea of trying to get broad geographic availability for these kinds of pieces of information and I would accept the Hall amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Landis. Anyone wishing to discuss the Hall-Landis amendment? Seeing none, Senator Hall to close. Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Hall-Landis amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hall and Landis' amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Schimek's amendment is the last I have, Mr. President.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Schimek to open.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. This is a very simple amendment which I am going to withdraw but I just want to talk about it a moment with the idea that I'm going to come back next year. This is an issue which I think Senator Hall has probably introduced before. It concerns death benefits under workmen's compensation. And the reason I want to bring it to you and I want to mention it is that I have
