

discussion on the amendment by Senator Kristensen? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen, would you like to close?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Briefly, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, again what I would ask you to do is adopt this amendment. We would then propose to bracket the bill until early next session and at that point in time we'll have an opportunity to examine some of the procedural things that have been raised here, but again not retreating upon the, I believe, the policy judgment of this Legislature and that's our purpose for going into the summer. It's not to revisit the mandatory issue but to make the system work. In the end I would offer these changes that we've made. I believe most of them are the sort of changes that we need to do. We converted from an optional system to a mandatory. The bill needed to have some references struck and some clarification, particularly on who was going to select the vendor, that not being the fire marshal. With that I would ask again for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. You've heard the closing on the Kristensen amendment. We'll now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
