

SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: (Recorder not activated) ...Legislative Chamber. With us as chaplain today we have Pastor Rod Wilmoth from the St. Paul Methodist Church in Omaha from Senator Will's district. Pastor.

PASTOR WILMOTH: (Prayer offered.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Pastor. I now call to order the eighty-eighth day of the Ninety-Third Legislature, First Session. Roll call. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Abboud.
