

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, just briefly, I also would support the reconsideration. And, obviously, the two...the taxes on each of the bills ought to occur at the same time and in view of the passage of LB 330, a million two, three difference because of the delay of implementation of LB 1022, it becomes pretty significant as to how much more is vetoed. So I would urge that both bills be reconsidered and be given the necessary 33 votes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise to support the return or the reconsideration. I rise to support the 33 votes for the emergency clause on 595. However, in contrast to Senator Lindsay, I cannot support LB 22, so I would ask you to support the reconsideration motion. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Haberman. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President and members of the body, I stand in support of the reconsideration motion and I say that very...with a lot of difficulty. I'm swallowing hard. But I agree with what has been said before. This...the one and a half million dollars is important for the budget. If the bill has passed and it's going into effect already, we might as well start collecting it right away. This doesn't mean that I won't come back another day and...and fight the concept of the bill, but that's over and we need to move on and we need to make sure we have a balanced budget. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. There are no further lights on. Senator Chambers, do you wish to close on your motion to reconsider?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just briefly, Mr. Speaker. As Senator Warner said, there might be a possibility of some veto activity, if we don't get this amount of money, that would come if we don't pass this bill with the emergency clause. Since executive officers from the presidency right on down reward friends and punish enemies, the Governor might look at those who did not support this and decide that the programs they had supported are the ones that should be vetoed out because by making this deliberate choice they were willing to sacrifice their program.
