PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

PRESIDENT ROBAK: (Recorder not activated) ...Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Brother John Bartleson from the United Methodist Church in Crawford, Nebraska, in Senator Wickersham's District. Brother John.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Brother John. Will you please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Any corrections to the Journal?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any announcements?

CLERK: Madam President, Education Committee, whose Chair is Senator Bohlke, reports LB 954 to General File, LB 1250 General File with amendments, LB 881 as indefinitely postponed. Those are signed by Senator Bohlke. (See page 617 of the Legislative Journal.) I have notice of hearing from the Appropriations Committee from February 16 and February 15, those signed by Senator Moore. That's all that I have, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Return to LB 254.

CLERK: Madam President, 254 is on Select File. Enrollment and Review amendments were adopted as of January 25. The bill was considered on the 27th. I do have amendments pending to the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Kristensen, could you please review for us where we are on LB 254, a little background on the bill?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam Speaker, and members of the Legislature. As you will remember, LB 254 is what has been called the Tingle bill, a bill that was introduced by myself in response to the Supreme Court case of State v. Tingle, where the authority of law enforcement was curtailed because they went past the boundary line of their primary jurisdiction to chase a
