SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. This is the twenty-second day of the Ninety-Third Legislature, Second Session. Our chaplain for the day is Associate Pastor Nancy Redman from the First Presbyterian Church here in Lincoln. Pastor.

PASTOR REDMAN: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Pastor Redman. Roll call. Senators, please record your presence. Mr. Clerk, please record.
