PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain this morning is Chaplain Harland Johnson.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Harland. It is the thirty-first day of the Ninety-Third Legislature, Second Session. Please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Madam President, I have report of registered lobbyists for this past week. I also have filed with me, as of last evening, the Speaker's list of priority bills, 1994 Speaker Priority Bills to be inserted in the Journal. That's all that I have at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you. We turn to legislative resolutions and begin with LR 318.

CLERK: Madam President, 318, offered by Senator Jones is found on page 783 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President and members of this body, this is about a small community in the southwest part of Custer County. Callaway, Nebraska has been the home of the annual Kite Flight on Labor Day weekend since 1991, and in 1991 thirty-five families registered to fly kites, and in 1993 the number of families registered to fly kites was 125. The Kite Flight will be held on Labor Day weekend, September 3rd, 4th, and 5th in Callaway, it's a population of 539. So in recognition of the success of this family event, the Legislature recognizes Callaway, Nebraska as the Kite Flight capital of Nebraska. Thank you.
