Senator Chambers isn't here, so I'll answer for him. No, he would not like to enter...include...Senator Chambers would not like to include Israel in this bill because it's racist. We...we should include everybody or no one. But we'll get to this point sooner or later as we go through these amendments, one by one by one. I have been told some people think I can't talk that long. Well, we're going to find out that they're wrong. I'm been sitting here for 16 years wanting...watching Senator Hall. I've been sitting here for 12 years watching Senator Land... What have you...got something to say, Senator Hall? Go ahead, use my time and say it.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members, Senator Haberman, I was just going to say, I came in here, you were kicking my tail; you're leaving and you're kicking my tail on the way out, so I'm...the more things change, the more they stay the same. So...
