SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Excuse me. No, Senator Wesely, that provision, by itself, would have absolutely no fiscal impact. The only potential for fiscal impact in the bill is with the early vesting provisions...

SENATOR WESELY: Vesting.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...that you would see if you're looking at the green copy of the bill on page 7, and the very top of...the very bottom of page 7...

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...and the very top of page 8.

SENATOR WESELY: And, for the record, I would support the earlier vesting; ten-year vesting is way too long. So I think that this sounds like a good amendment. I support the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any further discussion of the Wickersham amendment? Seeing none, Senator Wickersham, do you wish to close? He waives closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment to LB 1068. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Wickersham amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Madam President, I would move the advancement of LB 1068 to E & R engrossing.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor of advancing LB 1068 to E & R for engrossing indicate so by saying aye. All those opposed nay. LB 1068 advances.
