to other opportunities. That will probably still take place for those who leave the employ, but it is possible for an individual who owns an operation, owns a license to now designate themselves for multiple licenses that cross county lines. It's basically a technical, bookkeeping kind of consideration. As long as the Liquor Control Commission knows who is the manager of record and they are a resident of Nebraska, they are supportive of this measure, and I would urge the adoption of this portion, as well as Senator Landis's brew-pub amendment to LB 1292. Thank you, Madam President.
