PRESIDENT ROBAK: Are there any objections? So ordered. Thank you, Senator Crosby, now we are discussing the substitute amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Well are you going to introduce the new amendment then?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Not at microphone.) I did.

SENATOR CROSBY: Oh, well, that's what I thought, okay. I thought maybe I had misunderstood something. Thank you. But my point is that this is setting up a whole new mechanism and I just know that Department of Social Services will come to Appropriations if this is put in place and say, well now we have this whole new section of ADC rules and we have to have more caseworkers, we have to have more people in the office, it's going to cost you more. You see this is being sold to you as something that is going to save money. They do not have any numbers to show you that and what it's going to do is add to the bureaucracy. The caseworkers in place now I know are many times overworked because they don't have enough people or they don't have enough time and certain families take more time, but I still think that we are on a road here to setting up a whole new bureaucracy within Department of Social Services with these new things that they are supposed to monitor and enforce. So I'm going to look at the new handout and if I can support this, I will, and I do thank you, Senator Schimek, because I think we're on the right track on there. As far as I'm concerned, I think the whole third part should be eliminated altogether, but I'll come back with some things later. Thank you.
