

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, the purpose for getting this time is to explain what my amendment did. And I want Senator Schimek to stand here with me so she will see that her current amendment is not necessary. The only language...she's looking at the wrong amendment. You all don't pay attention to me. But here's what the amendment did that was adopted, in line 8 we struck, it is the intent of the Legislature, and inserted in its place, the Legislature directs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I can see, not only on this amendment, but probably the rest of the bill, the mood of the body, and I think you can see from how I fought this my mood. So we can battle here on all of it. But I say again Senator Wesely is going to offer a package of amendments and we will see whether that makes any substantive change in the bill. Some people think if any words are altered that is substantive, I don't. But they are the ones whose bill it is, and they want to massage it, put on a little cosmetic, and that's as much as I'm going to say about that. And some of their amendments, I think, are easily supportable
