Just ride out the storm and see what happens. One thing I'm noticing, my voice feels like to me it's getting stronger, maybe it's not, but when I was talking earlier I felt a kind of rough and raw feeling in it, but now all of that is gone away and I feel like I've got my second wind and I'm ready to stay here for as long as it takes. I have been here every night we went late and I've come back the next day and I'll do it for the rest of the session. We've only got what, five more, well four days after this? Four more days, four more days. There are other bills on Select File, other bills that people want to do other things with, but what is that to us?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We are locked in a titanic struggle. Those who want to tax my people and I don't want them taxed and those who want to take a tax off their people and I want to tax them. What did Patrick Henry say? Freedom for everybody or freedom for nobody, actually he didn't, he said give me liberty or give me death. Well give me debt or give me taxes, something like that. But at any rate we're going to be here and I want Senator Landis to know that if we get to his amendment, I'm going to badger it, I'm going to fight it, I'm going to do everything I can to prevent it's adoption. If it is adopted, I'm going to continue to fight it, 1087, and these other bills. But in the meantime, I will ask for a call of the house and I'll accept a machine vote on this motion to bracket until April 14. In fact, I think I will take a roll call vote and, Senator Ashford, I will oblige you and ask that it be done in reverse order.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
