CLERK:      32 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Warner amendment is adopted.    Mr. Clerk, anything further on the bill?

CLERK:      Senator Ashford would move to suspend the rules, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, Madam Speaker, and members, I would move to suspend the rules to allow for a debate on this matter without further amendment, the underlying bill, LB 1087, as amended. We've had a debate on the issue now. I think everyone fully understands it. There will be additional issues to be discussed tomorrow but I would ask that this...that we go ahead and have the vote up or down and suspend the rules and...to do that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, and I asked Senator Ashford what he meant, he said to have debate with no further amendments. So I would like him to clarify if that's what he meant, or if he meant something different.

SENATOR ASHFORD: I'm sorry, Senator Chambers. What I said...the motion says without further debate or amendment on the bill itself.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Right. And these amendments, if this is done and the bill moves, these amendments follow the bill to wherever it goes, don't they? Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: These amendments follow the...the ones that are pending would follow the bill wherever it goes.
