

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: However, if Senator Jones is wise, while he has the audience, he will begin to talk to them and arrive at a strategy. But if Senator Jones wants to talk to me, and Senator Coordsen and others would like to talk to me, I'm sure we could work something out. We could find a way out of this situation. But I'm opposing the motion to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There's no further dis...or lights. Senator Ashford, do you wish to close on your motion? No closing. The question before the body is whether or not to suspend the rules. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor and will senators please check in. The house is under call. Senator Landis, would you check in, please. Senator Monen, will you check in, please. Senator McKenzie. Mr. Clerk, please proceed. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1907 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 31 ayes, 9 nays.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We have suspended the rules. We now turn to a vote on LB 1087. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 1907-08 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 11 nays on the motion to advance LB 1087.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1087 advances to E & R initial. We now turn to LB 961.

CLERK: LB 961, Madam President, I have Enrollment and Review amendments, first of all.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Madam President, I would move the E & R
