ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 1224 correctly engrossed, LB 1224A correctly engrossed, LB 1207A to Select File, LB 1210A to Select File. SPEAKER WITHEM: Mr. Clerk, I understand there is a priority motion on the desk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Robak would move to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You have heard the motion. All in favor of adjournment, a machine vote has been requested. The motion is to adjourn until 9:00 a.m. tomorrow morning. All in favor of adjournment vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Robak requests a call of the house. All members, excuse me, let's vote on whether we want to go under call. All mem...the question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 1 nay to go under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. All members return, all members that are absent please return. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Members, please return and record your presence. Senator Robak, you asked for a call of the house. How would you want to proceed when members are here?

SENATOR ROBAK: Are all members here?

SPEAKER WITHEM: No, there is still about 15 members absent.
