SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And we have, we have some machinery to keep the grounds up. We have a small...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean like lawn mowers and things.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Lawn mowers and mowers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how much...and you'd have to levy a tax to get enough to pay the (interruption)...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I think it is more...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...personal things.
