SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I want the bill with or without the Hall amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then, members of the Legislature, if you want to give Senator Schellpeper a shot at his bill, I suggest that you support my motion to strike the Hall-Will amendment. And if you do that, I will withdraw my other motion. But if you don't, the bill has got to go.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 1354. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I will ask for a call of the house and I'll accept a machine vote when we're all here.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays.
