

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...where would...you can obviously see where the revenues from this...my amendment are obviously going to go. To which entities are your revenues going to go after-the gambling takes out their portion?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Robak, with my amendment that would be determined by the Legislature.

SENATOR ROBAK: And you would just leave it up to the Legislature to say that then, how it's going to...where the monies are going to go from your revenues?

SENATOR HALL: That's correct.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay, then I will have to say then that could be a very risky scenario, which I will again state that the large companies that are going to come in and operate the on-line lottery are largely...they can create a huge monopoly in the state. They can take over the whole state and dictate to the Legislature, you know how powerful lobbyists can be on certain issues, and they're going to be very powerful on this one, what they're for, would go all the city charities. I would say again the American Legion baseball, rescue squads, the churches, the parks and recreation, the community betterment, the playhouses, the Montessori schools, some scholarships, without this amendment the racetracks would virtually be dead. The racetracks need this bill...need this amendment. I urge your advancement of AM4496 to LR 293CA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I'd like the body's attention one second here because we have an extraord...not all that extraordinary, but an usual motion on the desk, and I would think maybe rather than working through the amendments right now, maybe we ought to go to that motion with the body's indulgence. A procedural sort of motion does not, by the rule book is not a priority motion, but I think maybe we ought to address that at this point. Mr. Clerk, can you read the motion.
