

the language, that's fine with me, so that was taken out. Again, we go on and talk, in Section 21, of the...again the user fee language is in there. We list the provisions that would be looked at for purposes of on-line specifications, and then move down to Section 22, and we again say that the committee appointed in Section 20 of this act shall issue an implementation plan, which was a change, it was an implementation recommendation. I think it was changed or studied and was changed to "plan", which is fine, and that they shall report or submit that to the Exec Board of the Legislative Council by March 1, 1995, and that's a change Senator Preister requested with regard to the time certain. It was earlier December 1, and he decided...wanted to have that moved back to March 1. That's fine with me, I have no objection to returning the bill for this specific amendment and would support that at this time. I'd relinquish any balance of the opening to Senator Preister.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Preister.
