

confined to wheelchairs, or who have other handicaps and who wish to hunt. It gives them a far greater chance of success if they can be issued an either sex permit. I was originally hopeful that this could be done as a matter of regulation. It was not able to be done by regulation, and so I'm bringing the bill. But the only other matter in it is a continuing effort to catch up with all the places where limited liability company should appear in the statutes, that entity that Senator Kristensen worked to create. With that, I would just ask that the bill be returned to Select File for the amendment and adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I support what Senator Wickersham is doing, I applaud him for doing it. I only have this to say, I feel a bit of sadness as a result of our discussion yesterday, because Senator Wickersham, your present bill deals with agricultural and horticultural land, and after all that you enlightened me to on (inaudible) of these things, I hate to see them go in this fashion. But you're doing a much nobler thing, and I will support you. I will cope with my sadness the best way that I can.
