

Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Madam President, I'll try to be brief. So far as I know, this bill was not opposed by any organizations, either of disabled or handicapped persons, or anyone who normally advocates for their interest. In fact, it has received support specifically from an organization called Outdoor Buddies, that happens to be an organization of individuals who assist handicapped persons or disabled persons in their hunting efforts. If they did not wish to avail themselves of the provisions of the bill, they would not have to. So if they are somehow...if they hold to the view that Senator Landis expressed and want to participate under the same conditions and as fully as anyone else, they may certainly do so. For those who wish to do otherwise, I think it is proper to enable them to do that.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Is there any further discussion on the amendment? Senator Wickersham, do you wish to close? Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment to LB 1088. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Madam President, I don't know if anyone can hear, but we have 22 yes votes on the board, 2 nay votes, and 21 not voting. Now we can spend time with a call of the house and...all right. Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a call of the house. Senators need to record your presence. There's a request for call-in votes. Senators need to return to their seats. We're on Final Reading, senators need to return to your seats. We accept call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Schellpeper voting yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays on the Select File amendment as offered by Senator Wickersham.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Select File amendment is adopted. Senator McKenzie.
