CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Without shilly-shallying, the Chambers amendment is adopted. Senator Kristensen. Is there any further discussion on the Kristensen amendment? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen, do you want to close? Okay, Senator Kristensen, you're recognized to speak and you are not closing.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. At this point, given the body's desire to take the summaries out, there is, I believe, a better way to word the amendment that is cleaner in the constitution that requires a few less words and probably is more understandable, that is an amendment that was printed by Senator Wesely, it's on page 740. And, I guess, procedurally I'm going to look, Mr. Clerk, I would ask at this point unanimous consent to substitute for Senator Wesely's AM2793, found on page 740, that's been printed in the Journal.

CLERK: Senator, I'm...just so I under...would you suggest to me again what it is you're trying to do and I'll...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I would like to substitute AM2793, found on page 740 of the Journal for my amendment.

CLERK: For your amendment?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

CLERK: I think, because it's been amended, you may have a problem, but you certainly could offer this as an amendment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Then that's the procedure...what we're looking at. I know that in a divided question, once it's been divided and changed you can't substitute, and I don't know that anybody is going to raise the objection of...and that's the reason I ask for unanimous consent. If not, I'll just make it...let's just do it that way. I see a head shake over here, I don't even want to take the time. Let me then at that point offer as an amendment to my amendment.
