CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2109 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 3 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1257 passes with the emergency clause attached. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LB 1364, LB 902, LB 902A, LB 1207, LB 1207A, LB 994, LB 1223, LB 1223A, LB 1275 and LB 1275A. SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body, I'd like to ask that LB 140 be passed over temporarily and be at the bottom of Item 6 on the agenda today.
