SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I just wanted to mention here this morning that I had this particular rule suspension motion filed a long time ago, certainly ahead of the one we talked about. But I felt that this bill is so important that it was necessary to have the conversation that we had this morning so that people could make their final arguments, either in opposition or support of 961 in the form that it currently exists. So, with that, Mr. Speaker, I would withdraw this motion.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Motion is withdrawn. Anything further?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Read the bill, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 961 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 961 pass? Have you all voted? Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2111-12 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 38 ayes, 9 nays, 2 present and voting, none excused.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 961 passes. Senator Hall has requested a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I just do this to point out a guest that I have under the balcony over here on my left, Pat Combs, who is a local businessman. His family is involved in a number of automobile enterprises and he also happens to be a candidate for Congress in the 1st District. I just wanted to introduce Pat, welcome him to the Legislature. Thank you, Mr. President.
