SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard closing. The question is the override of the veto as it relates to the trails program. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2135 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President, on the override.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The motion is not successful. Further motions, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Day would move to override the Governor's line-item veto, \$600,000 for the Children's Mental Health Road Map.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Day.

SENATOR DAY: Mr. Speaker and members, the children's road map, to refresh your memory, was a program that I believe started at \$400,000 in Appropriations. Appropriations raised it to 2 million. When it came to the floor, we cut it back to 1 million, and the Governor has cut this back to the original 400,000. This was important policy, it was good policy, and the reason I believe that was this was a grass roots effort. This came from the people in the regions that do this work, and work with the mentally ill. It was different for every region. Some of the regions were requesting like a 150,000, where others were requesting more, and they worked together to get this project done. It is a good investment for us. It is preventative. It will help with having to send these young people out of state. It will save money, but the problem that came down with this is one that has really frustrated me during this past year, and I think it is important that we discuss it, and that's the turf battles that exist. There have been turf battles in different regions. There have been turf battle on the state level, and no one knows exactly how this money will be spent unless the Governor cuts it. Now I always believed that our responsibility down here was to use the taxpayers dollars in the most productive way. This would be a productive way. It's a good
