PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Pastor Doyle Burbank-Williams from the Hallam-Martell United Methodist Church. Chaplain Burbank-Williams.

PASTOR BURBANK-WILLIAMS: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Pastor. I will now call the tenth legislative day to order. Will senators please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Pirsch. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President. I move that the rules as now in our possession be adopted for today only, Thursday, January 19, 1995.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any discussion to the motion? Seeing none, all those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. We have temporary rules. Mr. Clerk, are there any messages, reports and announcements? Before that, the Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes. One of the announcements this morning, just so the membership is aware, this is the tenth legislative day. It is, under our rules, that it is the last day for introduction of bills. The way we are going to work this will be the...we will be keeping in contact with the Bill Drafter's Office. We anticipate sometime this morning, probably later this morning as opposed to earlier this morning, the Bill Drafter's Office will report down when they have completed all of their requests for...senators' requests for drafts. When that happens, we will probably start running the clock and we will hang around about one hour longer, whenever that time is. If we get that message at eleven, then we will be able to do our
