PRESIDENT ROBAK PRESIDING

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. This morning our chaplain for the day is Pastor William Dressen from Faith Lutheran Church in Talmage, Nebraska and in Senator Vrtiska's district. Pastor Dressen.

PASTOR DRESSEN: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Pastor. I now call the seventy-first legislative day to order. Will senators please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections this morning, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any messages reports or announcements?

CLERK: An Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Wesely. (Re: LB 609.) A series of appointment letters from the Governor that will be referred to the Reference Committee for referral to Standing Committee for confirmation hearing. Senator Withem, amendments to LB 394 and I have resolutions for your signature, Madam President. That's all that I have at this time. (See pages 1903-12 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 96, LR 98, LR 99 and LR 100. Return now to General File and LB 592.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 592 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Day at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File, was discussed on April 25, Madam President. At that time the committee amendments were offered by the Judiciary Committee. Senator Day had amendments to the committee amendments that were adopted. When the Legislature left the bill Senator Lindsay had an amendment pending to the committee amendments. I understand that Senator Lindsay would like to pass that over pending his arrival.
