

SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. This is the eighty-fourth day, Tuesday, May 23, 1995, the eighty-fourth day of the Ninety-Fourth Legislature, First Session. CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.
