SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR COORDSEN: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the George W. Norris Chamber. Thursday, November (sic) 9, second day of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature, First Session. Our chaplain for the day is our Chaplain Coordinator Harland Johnson. Harland.

HARLAND JOHNSON: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Johnson. I now call to order the second day of the First Session of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature. Roll call. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Items for the record. We want to go to the temporary rules. I've got my microphone on. Senator Matzke, do you have a motion for us this morning?
