SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR COORDSEN: (Recorder not activated) ...George W. Norris Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Pastor Charles Schmidt, Grace Lutheran Church, Fairbury, Nebraska. He is from my district and is my pastor so, Pastor Schmidt, have at it.
