SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Pastor Fred Meuter of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Ceresco, from Senator Hudkins district. Pastor.

PASTOR MEUTER: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Pastor. I now call to order the seventy-ninth day, Tuesday, May 20, 1997, of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature, First Session. Roll call. Will you please record your presence. Record, please.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Any messages, reports, or announcement?

CLERK: I have no messages, reports, or announcements this morning.

SENATOR CROSBY: We proceed to Final Reading on the appropriations bill, LB 389. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, 389, on Final Reading. Senator Chambers would move to return the bill for a specific amendment (FA337). Senator, the first amendment I have this morning is the amendment to strike the Brashear amendment, it's found on page 2028 of the Journal.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, this relates to that DARE program. I don't remember how much money was put into it when we adopted Senator Brashear's amendment, but he gave a selling job to the Legislature during an evening of consideration on that bill.
