SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is Pastor Bryan Clark, from the Lincoln Berean Church, here in Lincoln. Pastor.

PASTOR CLARK: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Pastor. I now call to order the eighty-seventh day, Tuesday, June 3, 1997, of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature, First Session. Roll call. Will senators please record your presence. Record.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Messages, reports, or announcements?

CLERK: I have no messages, reports, or announcements at this time, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: We proceed to General File. LB 59, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (LB) 59, Madam President, introduced by Senator Wehrbein. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wehrbein, to open.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker, members, my intent is to simply pass over the bill after a couple minutes of discussion. This bill is my priority bill. It's a bill that I will be taking very seriously next year, when we come back. The reason I decided not to pursue it any further this year is that it will take some time and it is quite, I call it, technical in terms of understanding the situation between us and Missouri and the boundary.
