SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR COORDSEN: (Microphone not activated immediately)...Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain for the day is from Senator Engel's district, Pastor Terry Tomlinson, St. Paul Methodist Church, South Sioux City, Nebraska. Welcome Senator...Senator, or Pastor Tomlinson.

PASTOR TOMLINSON: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Pastor. I now call to order the twentieth legislative day of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature, Second Session. Roll call. I would like to announce that Senator Matzke is hosting the doctor for the day, Dr. Bob Rauner, from Sidney, Nebraska, seated under the north balcony. Dr. Rauner. I would also tell you, Dr. Rauner, that that's a...that's a familiar name in my community, too. Also Senator Hartnett has guests seated under the south balcony, Mary R. Maks and Dr. Stephen Maks, from Grand Island, Senator Hartnett's sister and brother-in-law. Welcome to the Chamber. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Corrections to the Journal?

ASSISTANT CLERK: I have none this morning.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Messages, reports, and announcements.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Your Committee on Transportation, whose Chairperson is Senator Bromm, reports (LB) 1151 as indefinitely postponed; (LB) 1316, indefinitely postponed. I have notice of committee hearing from the Transportation Committee, and from the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. Report of registered lobbyists for the week; a designation of LB 465 as Senator Witek's priority bill; an appointment letter to the Nebraska Employees Retirement Board from the Governor; the State Area Labor Summary, and the report of the Nebraska Intergovernmental Data Communications Advisory Council.
