SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Good morning and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. This morning our pastor of the day is Pastor Ronald Nuss-Warren from the First Presbyterian Church in Scottsbluff. Pastor, welcome.

PASTOR NUSS-WARREN: (Prayer offered.)
