SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR COORDSEN: Good morning. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our pastor for the day is Pastor Bob Swanson, Havelock Christian Church, which is in Senator Landis' district. Pastor Swanson.

PASTOR SWANSON: (Moment of silence for Senator Stan Schellpeper, who died April 4, 1999. Prayer offered.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Pastor. I now call to order the fifty-eighth legislative day, Ninety-Sixth Legislature, First Session. Roll call. I'd call your attention to a memo that is on your desks from the Clerk of the Legislature. This memo is in regard to the services for Senator Schellpeper who, as we all know, is not with us this morning as we gather. The service will be at 10:30 at the Stanton Middle School Gym. For those members and spouses who will be in Lincoln or in the environs Thursday morning, call your attention that we have made arrangements for bus transportation. It will be on the west side of the Capitol at 7:30. It's a two-hour drive, so we'll want to be on the bus as soon as we can at 7:30, or shortly following that. I also know that there are many of you that will be traveling from your homes with your spouse by private vehicle. We would also ask that you share with the Clerk's Office that fact, so that the funeral home will be able to provide sufficient seating at the service, so that the members of the Legislature and their spouses may all sit in one area. I think that would work out the best. And then the following day, on Friday, April 9th, upon adjournment, approximately 1:00 or 1:30 in the afternoon, we will be having a tribute service for Senator Schellpeper. His family will be able to be here. So as you plan the end of the week, it might be appropriate if we made an effort to be present to give the Legislature's final farewell to a good member. So this is on your desk, and if you have any questions, please contact the Clerk's Office. I think it's self-explanatory. But, with that, we shall continue then the business of the day. Record, Mr. Clerk.
