SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Good morning. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our acting chaplain this morning is Senator Schrock. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock, for doing that for us, we appreciate it. I call the fifty-sixth day of the Ninety-Seventh Legislature, Second Session, to order. Senators, please record your presence. Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: We've...we have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Any corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Just one item. I have the report of registered lobbyists for this week, to be inserted into the Journal, Mr. President. That's the only item I have this morning.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. First agenda item, motion to override Gubernatorial vetoes. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kristensen would move that LB 898 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kristensen, you're recognized to open on your motion.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. I feel like I'm a backup in a warm-up band this morning, for the main event. There was a veto given on LB 898. LB 898 is the bill that made the reduction in state aid. As you remember, state said TEEOSA itself did not take any hits in the special session, and wisely so, and that there was a small, hit here, but probably one that
