PRESIDENT HEINEMAN PRESIDING

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Good afternoon. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber for the third day of the Ninety-Seventh Legislature, First Special Session. Our chaplain for today is Senator Kruse. Please rise.

SENATOR KRUSE: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Kruse. I call the third day of the Ninety-Seventh Legislature, First Special Session to order. Senators, please record your presence, roll call. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Mr. Clerk, corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections this morning...or this afternoon, Mr. President, excuse me.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Mr. Clerk, messages, reports, or announcements?

CLERK: A series of hearing notices, Mr. President. The first from the Education Committee, signed by Senator Raikes; Health and Human Services Committee, signed by Senator Jensen; Transportation and Telecommunications, signed by Senator Bromm; Judiciary, signed by Senator Brashear; and the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee, signed by Senator Schimek.
